ORIGIN...

The Kentucky Forest Industries Association (KFIA) sponsors the William H. Steele Memorial Forestry Scholarship Fund, which is made available to deserving individuals who hope to pursue a career in forestry and the wood products industry.

KFIA is a trade association dedicated to serving and promoting the forest products industry of Kentucky. Founded in 1965, it has over 550 members in the areas of primary and secondary wood industry, supplier and service industries, wholesale, loggers and landowners. KFIA promotes sound forest management through the Sustainable Forestry Initiative and is involved with a number of programs to maintain the long term viability of all forest resources.

The scholarship was started in memory of William H. Steele, founder of Kentucky Tie & Lumber in Columbia, KY. Mr. Steele was active in KFIA, serving on the Board of Directors and as President. Kentucky Tie & Lumber remains a member of KFIA and Mr. Steele's son, Bill Steele Jr. has also served on the Board and as President with his son, the third generation of the family currently serving on the Board.

APPLICATION PROCEDURES AND GUIDELINES...

The William H. Steele Memorial Forestry Scholarship Fund will provide up to three \$1,000 scholarships (\$500 each semester) for students accepted for admission to, or currently enrolled in, an approved college or university, junior college, technical college, or accredited program. An additional \$600 scholarship is also available for qualified individuals to attend the NHLA Lumber Grading School in Memphis, TN.

Eligibility

Applicants must be US citizens and high school graduates in good academic standing with a 2.5 grade point average. Transcripts or institutional verification may be requested to document/verify academic standing. Recipients may be asked to demonstrate continued strong academic performance prior to receiving funds for the second semester.

Preference will be given to students demonstrating:

- Strong academic performance
- Interest in a career in forestry or the wood industry
- Experience working in the wood industry
- Commitment to a career in forestry or wood industry through successful completion of forestry coursework

Applications

Applications are due by October 1st of each year. The completed application form should be emailed to Bob Bauer, Executive Director, at bob@kfia.org.

Rick Goodin with Lebanon Oak Flooring in Lebanon, KY is the current Chairman of the KFIA Education Committee and the full committee will be the reviewing entity and make all decisions concerning scholarships. All decisions made by the committee are final.
