



# GS-0462-03 thru GS-0462-09, WG-5716-08 Duty locations and announcements

The National Forests and Grasslands in Texas are looking for a committed, hardworking, highly skilled workforce to suppress wildfires and work in fuels management in six potential duty locations including Lufkin, Ratcliff, Yellowpine, New Waverly, Zavalla, and Decatur, Texas. The fire and aviation management programs are very rewarding and requires talented people working safely as part of a team in a variety of specialized positions including dispatch, engine crews, fire and fuels management, and helitack crews. The Fire Hire program is being implemented to streamline the hiring process for permanent fire positions and provide consistent hiring around the Region and throughout the agency. This hiring process assists the National Forests and Grasslands in the Southern Region to fill vacancies in a more efficient and timely manner.

This outreach is for GS-0462-03 through GS-0462-09 and WG-5716-08 career permanent full-time fire positions. Some of these positions may potentially be eligible to be included in the GS-0456 Wildland Firefighter job series implementation. The vacancy announcements for these positions will be posted on the U.S. Government's official website for employment opportunities, <a href="https://www.usajobs.gov">https://www.usajobs.gov</a>. These are national vacancy announcements with a specific opening and closing date. The vacancy announcements will be open for applications between August 22 — September 24, 2024. Those who wish to be considered for these positions are highly encouraged to respond to this outreach notice by <a href="https://www.usajobs.gov">September 24, 2024</a>.

While these are the current vacancies available in Texas, please apply to any position and duty station you may be interested in, as those positions may become vacant through the Fire Hire process and will be eligible to be backfilled immediately. Applicants should check the status of their application during this time in your USAJobs account.

Please respond to the outreach notice through the contact listed for each position. Your response is important

#### **Important Dates:**

August 22, 2024—Vacancy announcements will be activated in USAJobs.

**September 24, 2024** —Application deadline, 11:59 Eastern standard time. Apply through www.usajobs.gov Applicants are encouraged to apply for multiple locations (where they would accept a position if offered), even if positions for certain locations in which you are interested are not listed as vacant. Vacancies may occur during the hiring process and could be filled during Selection Week.

**October 29, 2024** —Supervisory Reference Checks and Subject Matter Expert evaluations will begin to occur. Please ensure your references are notified of this and are available at the email address (preferred) or phone number provided on your application.

**October-December, 2024** — Selections. Representatives from each Forest will make recommendations for hiring. Candidates selected will be notified by a Forest Service representative by phone. Those not selected should check their USAJobs account for status updates. During the selection week, candidates will be given four hours to respond to voicemails or emails from the recommending officials. You are highly encouraged to be available via phone during this time.

**Note**: Interagency Fire Program Management (IFPM) and Forest Service – Fire Program Management (FS-FPM) qualifications must be met prior to vacancy closing date.

A current copy of your IQCS Master Record will be required for most positions in this outreach because of these qualification requirements.

#### How to Apply:

Please print and read the entire announcement and all the instructions before you begin.

You must complete the application process and submit all required documents electronically by 11:59 p.m. Eastern Time (ET) on the cut-off date or closing date of the announcement. Assistance is available during business hours (normally 8:00 a.m. - 4:00 p.m., Monday - Friday). Applying online is highly encouraged. If applying online poses a hardship, please contact the FS HRM Contact Center (Phone: 877-372-7248, Option 2) well before the closing date for an alternate method. All hardship application packages with supporting documents must be received no later than noon on the closing date of the announcement in order to be entered into the system prior to its closing. This agency provides reasonable accommodation to applicants with disabilities on a case-by-case basis. Please contact the FS HRM Contact Center if you require this for any part of the application and hiring process.

#### Step 1 – Create a USAJobs account

If you do not already have an account, please create one at www.usajobs.gov. It is recommended that, as part of your profile, you set up automatic email notification to be informed when the status of your application changes. If you choose not to set up this automatic notification, you will have to log into your USAJobs account to check on the status of your application.

## Step 2 - Create a resume with USAJobs or upload a resume into your USAJobs account.

You may want to customize your resume to ensure it documents duties and accomplishments you have gained that are directly related to the position(s) to which you are applying in order to verify that qualifications are met. In addition, your resume must support your responses to the online questionnaire. You may preview the online questionnaire by clicking on the link at the end of the How You Will Be Evaluated section of the job announcement.

### Step 3 - Click "Apply Online"

Follow the prompts to complete the Occupational Questionnaire and attach any additional documents that may be required. You can update your application or documents at any time while before the announcement closes. Simply log into your USAJobs account and click on "Application Status." Click on the position title, and then select "Update Application" to continue.

The following documents must be submitted to constitute a complete application package. It is your responsibility to ensure that all required documents are received within the required timeframes. Our office cannot be responsible for incompatible software, delays in the mail service, etc. Failure to submit required, legible documents will result in elimination from consideration.

- **Resume** that includes the following information: 1) job information for which you are applying, 2) personal information, 3) education, 4) work experience, and 5) other qualifications (including IQCS Master Record).
- College Transcripts if education is required for meeting basic qualifications and/or you are substituting
  education for specialized experience. An unofficial copy is sufficient with the application. If selected, however,
  an official college transcript will be required.
- DD-214 (Member 4 Copy) and/or SF-15 Application for 10-point Veteran Preference if claiming Veterans'
   Preference or eligibility for appointment under the VRA, VEOA, or 30% Disabled Veterans hiring authority.
- **SF-50** Notification of Personnel Action if you are a current or former Federal employee that will verify your federal status, position title, series, and grade. FSA County employees must provide the most recent notification of Personnel Action (Form SF-50-B or FSA-50) that verifies permanent status. Also provide the SF-50 that reflects the highest grade level held on a permanent basis or the full performance level of your current position, whichever is higher.
- **Annual Performance Appraisal** if you are a current Federal employee. Submit the most recently completed annual performance appraisal (dated within 18 months) which identifies the employee's official rating of record, signed by the supervisor, or a statement advising why the performance appraisal is unavailable. Do not submit a performance plan.
- **Certification of Disability** if you are eligible for appointment based on a disability under the Schedule A hiring authority. This certification can be documented by a counselor from a State Vocational Rehabilitation Agency or the Vocational Rehabilitation and Employment Service of the Department of Veterans Affairs; by a statement or letter on a physician/medical professionals' letterhead stationary; or by statements, records, or letters from a Federal Government agency that issues or provides disability benefits. The certification must verify the applicant has a severe disability, is eligible under a Schedule A appointment authority, and he or she is able to perform the essential duties of the position. The certification must also describe any needed reasonable accommodation. You can review additional information at: <a href="Federal Employment of People with Disabilities">Federal Employment of People with Disabilities</a>.
- **Proof of Eligibility** if you are eligible for appointment based on service in the Peace Corps, Vista, Action Cooperative, or another special authority.
- CTAP/ICTAP documentation if separated from Federal service or pending separation based on a reduction in force (RIF) or other management workforce reduction action. Proof of eligibility must include a separation notice or Certificate of Expected Separation, SF-50 that documents the RIF separation action or most recent SF-50 (that is not an award), and latest performance appraisal (dated within the last 18 months) or a statement advising why one is unavailable.
- **IQCS Master Record** showing your training and qualifications for the position. If an IQCS Master Record in not available, some form of documented proof of training and qualifications will be needed for most positions.

NOTE: If a document is resubmitted, it replaces the previous submission, which means the previous document is no longer available to the Human Resources Office. If you are adding to, rather than replacing a previous submission, you must upload both the old document and the new document.

#### Things to keep in mind when applying:

- □ Vacancy Announcements on USAJobs will give examples of the specialized experience for each position advertised. Ensure your resume matches the listed specialized experience requirement in plain language. This should be listed under a work experience that shows title, series, grade, and time period performed so that HR can properly credit. Ensure all SF-50s show onboarding/off-boarding and performance for each time period or statement as to why that time period is missing is properly loaded into USAJobs.
- Ensure all required documents listed in the vacancy announcement are attached to your application.
- □ Allow yourself plenty of time to apply for positions. The USAStaffing system closes all announcements at midnight Eastern on closing date.
- □ Print and read the entire vacancy announcement to ensure you have included all required information and documents.
- ☐ Ensure you have a current IQCS Master Record (For Fire Positions Only).

#### ABOUT THE FORESTS

The National Forests and Grasslands in Texas includes the Angelina NF, Caddo LBJ Grasslands, Davy Crockett NF, Sabine NF, and Sam Houston NF. The forest units are located in Southeast Texas and the Caddo LBJ Grasslands is located in north central Texas just north of Dallas / Fort Worth. Combined, it is approximately 720,000 acres. A full range of vegetation and recreation management activities on the forest include timber harvest and regeneration activities, TSI, prescribed fire, developed and dispersed recreation, and mineral exploitation. The forest has a very large prescribed fire program burning 150,000 acres per year across the forest and grasslands.

## Angelina / Sabine Ranger District (includes the Angelina and Sabine National Forest)

The Angelina/Sabine Ranger District administers 314,000 acres of the Angelina and Sabine National Forests. The District is located in the "Pineywoods" region of East Texas, an area of gently hilly, densely forested land. The region is rural. The district has an aggressive fuels reduction program with annual prescribed burning accomplishments averaging 70,000 acres per year. Fire suppression load averages around 20 to 40 fires per year. The Fire Management Organization consists of a DFMO, 2 AFMO's , Fuels Tech, Prevention Tech, 4 Equipment Operators, and 8 Firefighters, plus numerous militia personnel.

District Offices are located in Milam and Zavalla, with two workcenters located in Zavalla and Yellowpine (5 miles south of Milam). The Supervisor's Office is located in Lufkin.

#### Caddo LBJ National Grasslands

Since the 1930s, Wise, Montague, and Fannin County have been home to a unique natural resource, the Caddo-LBJ National Grasslands (CLBJ). The District hosts a complex plan of work to include 53% of the region's grazing program, a burgeoning oil & gas program, the potential acquisition of a land donation totally nearly 15,000 acres, wildlife habitat improvement projects in partnership with the National Wild Turkey Federation, a National Historic Site, and a very busy recreation program serving over 7-million people within an hour of Caddo-LBJ National Grasslands. The District Office located in Decatur, Texas is approximately 240-miles from the Supervisor's Office in Lufkin, TX. Additionally, the two combined Districts Caddo and LBJ are over 130-miles apart. The CLBJ is approximately 38,000 acres (LBJ National Grassland = 20,300 + acres, Caddo National Grassland =17,800 + acres). Due to the proximity to the Dallas/Fort Worth metropolis and the small percentage of public lands in Texas, recreation and special uses are exponentially growing and complex programs. On the LBJ National Grassland, hunters can find whitetail deer, Rio Grande turkey, and small game such as rabbits, squirrel, and a few quail. While much of the acreage is open to hunters, families looking for a place to picnic and camp can venture out to one of the area's small lakes and ponds. There is over 75-miles of multiple-use trails. The Caddo National Grassland, located in Fannin County, offers the same recreational opportunities as the LBJ; however, the lakes are much larger in size and the Eastern turkey represented. Paved boat ramps and fishing piers are available from the campground's parking area. There are over 25-miles of multiple-use trails.

#### **Davy Crockett National Forest**

The Davy Crockett National Forest, named for the legendary pioneer, contains more than 160,000 acres of East Texas woodlands, streams, recreation areas, and wildlife habitat. Located in Houston and Trinity Counties, the forest is centrally located within the Neches and Trinity River basins. The Davy Crockett National Forest was proclaimed a National Forest by President Franklin Roosevelt on October 15, 1936.

The District hosts active recreation, archeological, minerals, timber, and fuels treatment programs with emphasis on the former Chief's four threats: fire & fuels, invasive species, loss of open space, and unmanaged recreation.

The Davy Crockett Ranger District office is located near Ratcliff, TX on Highway 7 about one-quarter mile west of FM 227 in Houston County.

#### Sam Houston National Forest

The Sam Houston National Forest is one of 4 National Forests and 2 National Grasslands managed by the USDA Forest Service in Texas. Located on the western edge of the piney woods of East Texas, there are 163,030 acres of national forest land in Montgomery, San Jacinto, and Walker Counties. The Sam Houston is designated an Urban National Forest because of its proximity to Houston, Texas. The district manages a very active hazardous fuels program managing fuels in a rapidly expanding and complex urban interface. The district annually prescribe burns 35-40,000 acres per year and has an active suppression program as well. On the west side of the district, national forest surrounds the north end of Lake Conroe, a 22,000-acre reservoir that provides water for Houston and recreation for thousands of visitors each weekend.
