Reporting to the Board of Directors, this full-time role is responsible for overseeing all aspects of tree planting and care, staff leadership, community engagement, and grant-funded projects. The Director of Programs will be instrumental in strengthening our impact, building meaningful partnerships, and ensuring the long-term success of our mission.

Key Responsibilities

Project Management & Urban Forestry

- Plan and execute all tree planting and maintenance projects in alignment with organizational goals
- Oversee tree selection, ordering, site preparation, scheduling, and partner coordination
- Supervise staff and volunteers to ensure effective watering, pruning, and monitoring
- Track tree health metrics and implement corrective actions to maximize survival rates
